




Session Types

- Lightning Talks, brief, to-the-point, prepared presentations on a specific Internet governance issue;
- Networking Sessions, gatherings of stakeholders interested in the same or similar issue;
- DC Sessions, as collaborative sessions organized by multistakeholder teams of different DCs;
- NRIs Sessions, as collaborative sessions organized by multistakeholder teams of NRIs coming from different regions;
- Intersessional work sessions, organized by the facilitators of IGF Best Practice Forums and Policy Networks;
- Music Night,
- Pre-events, sessions hosted on the day before the IGF official programme begins.
- IGF Village booths exhibition booths where organizations can showcase their non-commercial Internet governance-related work



IGF 2025 Timeline


